> The academy is a 1,535member non-profit group of attorneys, criminologists, pathologists, document examiners and other professionals dedicated to furthering criminal justice.

> A glaring discrepancy in the evidence, Joling said, arises from the Los Angeles County Medical Examiner's finding that "the shot that hit the senator above the right ear had to have been fired from no more than 1 to 3 inches away."

> But Richard Lubic, 37, a television producer who was next to the senator at the moment of the shooting, told The ENQUIRER:
