

Probe Delayed On JFK, King

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House Rules Committee postponed action yesterday on a resolution to re-establish a House committee to investigate the assassinations of President John F. Kennedy and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The committee, which must decide whether the resolution can be sent to the House floor for final action, postponed its vote and recessed to Feb. 1 after hearing almost five hours of testimony supporting and opposing the re-establishment of the committee.

Rep. Henry Gonzalez, D-Tex., who would head the committee if it is re-established, told the Rules panel that federal law enforcement agencies are trying to block a new probe of two murders.
