On November 22, 1963, Mrs. JOHN O. THOMPSON, Manager, Austin Hotel, 1530 North Congress Street, Austin, Texas, advised SA H. T. BUSH that BRUCE RANDLE, 2439 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, had arrived at that hotel at approximately 7:00 PM, November 22, 1963, with one BERRY J. CASNER, 214 West Shady Grove, Irving, in a 1963 Chevrolet pick up, bearing 1963 Texas licence 3F8023. They both claimed to be employees of the Irving Counter Top Company, no street address given.

RANDLE claimed that he lived two or three doors from MRS MARVIN OSWALD and that RANDLE's wife worked in the same building as OSWALD. RANDLE also mentioned that it had been rumored in Dallas that if the President came to Dallas, he would be killed on account of the Veterans Administration offices being moved out of Dallas, Texas. RANDLE indicated a personal acquaintanceship with MRS H. OSWALD but did not indicate the degree of association.

RANDLE attempted unsuccessfully to contact one MARVIN RANDLE, telephone number BL 3-9049, at Irving, Texas, about 7:30 PM, November 22, 1963.

Mrs. THOMPSON advised that subsequently, on the same date, RANDLE returned to the hotel and placed a long-distance call to the same number, and reported that he had learned that his wife had been called in for questioning concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY. RANDLE checked out of the hotel and reportedly returned to Dallas by plane, at 11:05 PM, on November 22, 1963. Mrs. THOMPSON reported that BERRY J. CASNER checked out of the hotel at 7:00 AM, November 23, 1963, with stated destination of Irving, Texas.

LINNIE MAE RANDLE, 2439 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, was interviewed on December 1, 1963, by SAs BARBARELL D. COUL and HEDON E. MC INERLY. She advised that she was the sister of BURELL WESLEY FRAZIER, who was employed by the Texas School Book Depository and who has also been interviewed. She also furnished other information of value which has been reported.
