

On November 22, 1963, Mrs. JOHN O. THOMPSON, Manager, Austin Motel, 1400 South Congress Street, Austin, Texas, advised SA H. T. BURN that ERNIE RANDOLPH, 2439 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, had arrived at that motel at approximately 7:00 PM, November 22, 1963, with one ERNIE J. CASHIER, 214 West Shady Grove, Irving, in a 1963 Chevrolet pick up, bearing 1963 Texas license 3F6028. They both claimed to be employees of the Irving Counter Top Company, no street address given.

RANDOLPH claimed that he lived two or three doors from LEE HARVEY OSWALD and that RANDOLPH's wife worked in the same building as OSWALD. RANDOLPH also mentioned that it had been rumored in Dallas that if the President came to Dallas, he would be killed on account of the Veterans Administration offices being moved out of Dallas, Texas. RANDOLPH indicated a personal acquaintanceship with LEE H. OSWALD but did not indicate the degree of association.

RANDOLPH attempted unsuccessfully to contact one MARVIN RANDOLPH, telephone number BI 3-0040, at Irving, Texas, about 7:30 PM, November 22, 1963.

Mrs. THOMPSON advised that subsequently, on the same date, RANDOLPH returned to the motel and placed a long-distance call to the same number, and reported that he had learned that his wife had been called in for questioning concerning the assassination of President KENNEDY. RANDOLPH checked out of the motel and reportedly returned to Dallas by plane, at 11:05 PM, on November 22, 1963. Mrs. THOMPSON reported that ERNIE J. CASHIER checked out of the motel at 7:00 AM, November 22, 1963, with stated destination of Irving, Texas.

LINNIE MAE RANDOLPH, 2439 West Fifth Street, Irving, Texas, was interviewed on December 1, 1963, by SAs BARNHILL D. COUL and GILBERT B. MC WHIRTY. She advised that she was the sister of BOBBLIE MURKIN FRIZZELL, who was employed by the Texas School Book Depository and who has also been interviewed. She also furnished other information of value which has been reported.
