Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY. Dallas Police Department, advised on December 2, 1963, that he could not release the original negatives from his department at this time because of an impending court of inquiry by the Attorney General of Texas. Chief CURRY had made up negative copies of all the photographs in their possession of the crime scene where President JOHN F. KENNEDY was assassinated and turned them over to this office on December 3, 1963.

Chief CURRY stated that these photographs were made by Lt. CARL DAY of the Crime Laboratory of the Dallas Police Department.

The following are the copies of the negatives obtained from Chief of Police JESSE E. CURRY and forwarded to the FBI Laboratory:

- 1. Gun at original position where found on North West portion of 6th floor, 411 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas
- 2. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. Looking at hulls found from east to west
  - 3. Exterior View. Front of 411 Blm Street
- 4. RECONSTRUCTED. 6TH FLOOR. This picture was re-constructed November 25, 1963 showing the exact locations of the boxes and the box with the palm print on the box. (Chief CURRY advised that Lieutenant CARL DAY stated this scene was reconstructed as it was first found by the Dallas Police Department)
- 5. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. From north to south where lunch was found. (Chief CURRY advised Lieutenant CARL DAY said it had been dotermined that another employee and not CSVALD had caten this lunch.)

- 6. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. Towards window where lunch was found. From North to South. (Chief CURRY advised that Lt. CARL DAY stated it had been determined that another employee and not OSWALD had eaten this lunch)
- 7. Exterior Photo, 411 Elm. Taken standing on parkway at triple underpass towards building where the shots were fired
- 8. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. Looking towards box taped. Gun found behind the box taped. Photo taken from stairway on 6th floor.
- 9. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. From 6th floor standing at stairway looking towards service elevator. Gun found to the right of the picture
- 10. 1 Negative. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. 6th Floor, looking towards stairway from east to the west side of building. Apparent escape route. Gun found to left of stairway sign.

- 14. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. Picture taken standing on the 6th floor looking towards stairway leading to the 5th floor.

- 40. 6th Floor, 411 Elm. RECONSTRUCTED. Standing on top of boxes looking down towards boxes that were used in shooting. Palm print replaced on box. Paper that the gun was wrapped in was in the upper right hand corner of picture
- 41. Photos of gun taken at I. D. Bureau at the Dallas Police Department
