The nature of the tests Ruby will undergo was not announced. But a doctor who has been treating him said that it would include X-rays.

Ruby, scheduled to be tried in February for murdering Lee Harvey Oswald, President Kennedy's assassin, was admitted to the hospital Friday night after complaining of a "bind-ing" feeling in his chest.
