Ruby's counsel  
requests delay  
for hearing

WASHINGTON (AP) — Counsel for Jack Ruby filed a request in the Supreme Court Thursday for a stay of a sanity hearing scheduled June 13 in Criminal Court in Dallas, Tex.

Ruby was convicted as the slayer of Lee Harvey Oswald, identified by the Warren Commission as the assassin of President John F. Kennedy. Ruby was given the death penalty.

The request also asked for a stay of all state court appeal proceedings pending the filing of an appeal to the Supreme Court. The Supreme Court appeal would be from denial of a writ of habeas corpus by Judge Louis T. Holland of Dallas.
