Dear Mr. Moen,

Thank you for your gratifying remarks about Accessories. The reason for your difficulty in obtaining the Subject Index is that it has been out of print for two years. Because I continue to receive urgent requests for the Index from time to time, I keep on hand a xerox copy which is available to anyone who wishes to borrow it for no longer than two weeks and re-copy it. (The time-limit is only to make sure that the xerox copy will be available to the next borrower.)

The Subject Index, I should explain, is literally an index (not a text or narrative) to the contents of the Warren Report and the 26 volumes of the Hearings and Exhibits (testimony and documents). It is useful only if one possesses, or has access to, the 26 volumes.

If you would like to have the loan of the xerox copy, please write and let me know and if possible include postage stamps to cover mailing (set of about 150 pages). I will then mail the xerox set to you, on the understanding that you will make one copy only for your own personal use and that you will return it in about two weeks. If you wish to do so, I should be interested to know whether you are doing research on the case, or want the Index for a different purpose. I am always glad to know when a new researcher or student of the evidence enters the scene; in this complex case, new energy and new insight should always be welcomed.
