TOM C. DILLARD, residence, 7022 Marilee Lane, Dallas, Texas, a photographer for "The Dallas Morning News," was requested on July 23, 1964, to furnish prints of any photographs he took on November 23, 1963, of a mark on the curb, which mark was located on the south side of Main Street, just east of the triple underpass. Mr. DILLARD was requested to furnish a print of the entire negative of each photograph taken without any cropping.

On July 24, 1964, Mr. DILLARD furnished two 8" x 10" glossy prints on each of which there is a 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 7 3/8" photograph. These photographs are identified on the back by the letters "A" and "B". He stated these were prints made from the entire negative, without any cropping, and were copies of two photographs he took of the mark on the curb.

From photograph "A", a blowup was made and a copy of this blowup had been previously furnished by Mr. DILLARD to an Assistant United States Attorney in Dallas. A copy of photograph "B" is differentiated from photograph "A", in that in the upper left-hand background of photograph "B", there can be seen a manhole cover.
