WARREN COMMISSION A FARCE, SAYS WITNESSES

DALLAS-- Robert A. Surrey of Dallas holds key information which might yet unlock the mystery of who were Oswald's accomplices.

Surrey was summoned to Washington June 16 by the Warren Commission.

After 3 1/2 hours of questioning by Earl Warren and Hale Boggs, Surrey returned to Dallas convinced that the commission exists for something other than its announced purpose.

"The Warren Commission is a farce, a colossal joke on the American people," he said.

The young Dallas publisher gave part of his story to The Councilor in an exclusive interview. He will tell the rest of it at an Independence Day rally in Calhoun, La., July 4. Hundreds of people are expected to hear his report.

"It (the commission) seemed more interested in trying to get information about patriotic activities in Dallas than in learning what I know about the attempt to assassinate Ted Walker," he said. He referred to the rifle shot at Edwin A. Walker, former major general, which was fired by Oswald, according to Marina Oswald. Leftwing propaganda has portrayed Oswald as a "loner" in the assassination of John Kennedy, and any proof of accomplices in the attempt on Walker's life might shatter this carefully-nurtured image.

"As most Councilor readers know, I saw two men roaming a-

round Walker's house just before the attempt to shoot him", Surrey continued.

"In Washington they showed me a picture of Oswald and asked me if he looked like one of the men. After I replied that he didn't, they were very anxious to move on to other topics. I suggested that they show me pic-

tures of other people who were close to Oswald in those days, but this apparently didn't meet with their approval."
