Dear Mrs. Stamm:

I read with interest your article in the July 19 issue of Computers & Automation on the shooting of George Walla. I am an associate editor of the magazine and one of the authors of the series of articles on assassinations. I am also a co-founder and member of the board of the Committee to Investigate Assassinations whose headquarters are in Wash. D.C.

I would like to know whether you have the time and the interest to do some further research on behalf of the Committee on the Wallace assassination attempt. This research would probably involve traveling to the scene of Bremer's trial and possibly attending for a few days. If so, the Committee would pay your expenses.

We believe, as I'm sure you do, that there is a definite possibility of conspiracy in the case. We feel that Bremer's family and lawyer might believe the same thing, especially if Bremer was hypnotized in the same manner as Sirhan by someone else.

If Bremer read Kaiser's book he may have picked up the idea of hypnosis, or he may wonder about whether he was hypnotized. I understand he has asked for the book again while in jail. His lawyer made an opening statement yesterday claiming that Bremer can't remember shooting Wallace. The lawyer also stated there were

more wounds than five bullets could have created and that FBI evidence would show that Bremer may not have fired all of the shots. He stated that Bremer fingerprints were not on the gun.

One of our members has a direct contact with the investigative people in Maryland, and we can make contact with Bremer's lawyer and family for you if necessary.
