RAY stated that also in attendance was GroRGE BOUHE, 4740 Homer Street, Apartment 0, telephone TA 7on2288, Dallas, Texas. RAY identified BOUEE as a bachelor who apparently keeps in contact with as many Russian-abon people as be can.

Also at this party weve Mre and Mrs. TEOFIL MELIER, $5930 \frac{1}{2}$ LaYista Dujve, telephone TA 3022:9, DaLras, Texas. Both of these peqpie are Russian boxn.

Aso present at the paxty was an indivtduat named FRANK RAY and his Bussianoborn wife. PRANK RAY is no relation to rhonAs RAY, and THOlRAS RAY stated he did not know their address and that they may now be separated.

RAY Expiained that a busimessman, C。E。 HARPIS, JRo, 904 East L 2 th Strest, Georgetown, Texas, telephone re $3=3036$, and his wife, who is Ruseian boxn, were aiso at the parey.
