Mrs. IRENE VAYSLEP was interviewed at her residence, 6011 Ellsworth Drive in the presence of her husband, VITALY VAYSLEP.

Mrs. VAYSLEP advised that she recalls meeting LEE HARVEY OSWALD and MARINA OSWALD at the home of Mrs. HELENA HALL in Fort Worth, Texas in the fall of 1962, where she had gone with Mr. GEORGE BOUHE of Dallas to bring clothes to MARINA and her baby.

MARINA OSWALD again prior to December, 1962 when she, Mr. BOUHE, and Mrs. ANNA MELLER of Dallas attended a concert at the McFarland Auditorium at Southern Methodist University. On this occasion, MARINA OSWALD was not accompanied by LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Mrs. VAYSLEP said that the last time that she met LEE HARVEY and MARINA OSWALD was at a Christmas Party in December, 1962 at the home of Mrs. Declan FORD in Dallas, Texas. Mrs. VAYSLEP advised that on this occasion although she saw both LEE HARVEY and MARINA OSWALD, she only spoke briefly to MARINA in general conversation.

Mrs. VAYSLEP advised that it was her impression that IME HARVEY OSHALD was very quiet and never said anything of an unusual or suspicious nature which would lead her to believe that he was an agent of the Russian government. It was her understanding that Mrs. MARINA OSMALD was happy in the United States although she had heard that IME HARVEY OSWALD had beat her on several occasions. She described MARINA OSWALD's Russian speech as average colloquial Russian with no outstanding attributes concerning it, and pointed out that MARINA OSWALD had taken a delight in the everyday aspects of American life such as laundromats and super markets.
