On December 5, 1938, Mr. FAWEL DYNTTRUK contacted the Dallas Office of the FBI and advised he is presently residing in the downtown YNCA, Dallas, Texas. Mr. DYNKTRUK requested to speak to an Agent of the FBI and was interviewed by SA JAMES P. WOSTY, JR.

DYMITRUK stated he was originally from the Soviet Union, having served in the Soviet Army during World War II, and is presently a refugee in this country, having fled from the Soviet Union during World War II.

DYMITRUK stated he contacted the Dallas Office of the FBI to detormine if he could obtain a security clearance since, due to his Russian background, he finds great difficulty in securing employment. DYMITRUX was advised that the FBI does not grant security clearances and this office would not be able to applict him in this matter.

On May 23, 1961, Mr. PAMEL DYNITRUK who, at that time gave his address as 312 North Gilpin Avenue, Apartment 202, Dallas, Texas, contacted the Dallas Office of the FBI and requested to see SA JAMES P. HOSTY, JR:

DYMITTRUK stated he was having difficulty obtaining a job, in view of his Russian background, and stated he had recently divorced his wife and that everything was going wrong and he wanted the FBI to assist him. DYMITRUK was again advised that the FBI does not grant security clearances and that there was nothing this office could do to assist him.
