Sheriff BILL DECKER, Dallas, Texas, advised that Deputy Sheriff ROGER GRAIG: in his opinion, is a reliable employee who is completely bonest in his belief that he saw OSWALD getting into a white Nash Rambler immediately after the shooting, even though CRAIG is obviously mistaken in his belief. DECKER said that he had discussed this identification with CRAIG and pointed out to him that witnesses, corroborated by the transfer found in OSWALD's possession, showed that OSWALD left the assassination scene on November 22, 1963, by a city bus. CRAIG stated to DECKER that he was aware of all that and knew that this indicated that CRAIG was mistaken in his identification, but he still saw someone getting into a white Nash Rambler and still believed that this person was LEE HARVEY OSWALD.
