WILLIAMS is an employee of the Texas School Book Depository, Elm at Houston Street, Dallas, Texas and has been for the past 12 years.

On November 22, 1963 at the time the Presidential Procession passed the Texas School Book Depository Building, WILLIANS us on the front steps of the building. The Presidential car had just passed the building a few seconds and was out of sight over the embankment when WILLTANS heard three loud blasts. He thought these blasts came from the location of the court house. He did not look up and inmediately went back into the building into his office on the second floor. A few minutes later, Detectives came into the building and he went with a Detective to check the second floor of the building. WILLIAMS remained in the building until approximately 3 FM, at which time the building was closed.

WILLIAMS is not acquainted with LEE HARVEY OSWALD, an employee of the Texas School Book Depository. He has possibly seen OSWALD in the building, but cannot recall miri.
