Nixon Pals, CIA Linked To RFK Assassination

The web of illicit CIA activity and the curious acquaintanceships of Richard Nixon are spreading to include the assassination of Robert F. Kennedy.

On the eighth anniversary of his death on June 6th, 1968, this is what an exhaustive investigation concludes.

Sirhan Sirhan didn't kill RFK alone. The chain of events that brought him to the United States from Palestine and put the gun in his hand implicates many.

The link between the Sirhan family and the CIA goes far back.

It starts in Palestine where American agents within the Greek Orthodox church gave money to the Sirhans. It continues with an agreement to bring them to America.

It involves a well-to-do California husband and wife who sponsored their passage to this country.

The wife, the study claims, is the sister of an old college chum of both Richard and Pat

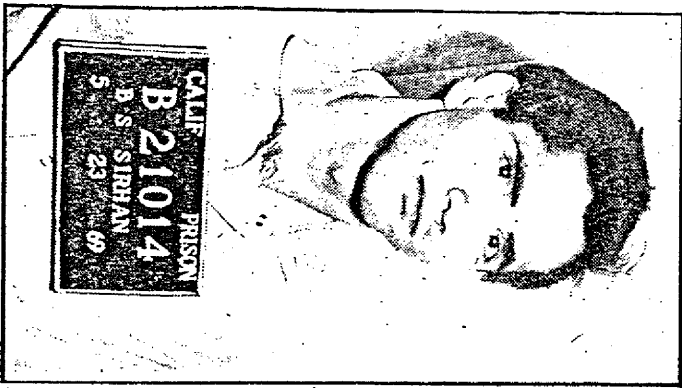

Mae Brussell is a writer, lecturer and radio broadcaster, but above all she is the most serious student and investigator of assassinations in this country.

Miss Brussell is the author of dozens of articles which have appeared in American newspapers and magazines; she has spoken at a score of universities on the assassination of the Kennedy brothers and she has been a regular lecturer at Monterey Peninsula College.

As a radio commentator, she originated one of the most unusual programs in the history of broadcasting. Called "Dialogue Conspiracy," it became syndicated across the country.
