## Library Adds Six New Books To Its Shelves

Bethlehem Public Library today announced the titles of six new books among those added to the shelves. They are:

"Japan in Color," by Roloff Beny. The text of this work on Japan has been written by Anthony Thwaite, an authority on the land and its people. The color photography is by a Canadian photographer.

"A Place to Live," by Wolf Van Eckardt. Wolf Van Eckardt, architecture critic for the Washington Post, explains the crisis in which American cities find themselves and his suggestions should be interesting to architects, city-planners, and administrators of urban renewal programs.

"Accessories After the Fact," by Sylvia Meagher. Documented study on the death of President Kennedy and of the Warren Commission's report, with the purpose of presenting a comparative analysis of the report with actual testimony to prove that the Commission's conclusions are false.

"The Complete Swindler," by Ralph Hancock. A book about the many ways in which the con-game is practiced, today as well as yesterday, with observations on the swindler and the swindled, and the conclusion that it is hard to cheat an honest man.

"The Thumb on the Scale," by A. Q. Mowbray. Account of the congressional hearings led by Senator Hart on supermarket packaging abuses and the reasons for the defeat of the Hart bill with its provisions and regulations.

"Cats' Kingdom," by Hartley Ramsay. Cat lovers will enjoy the antics of Maxie, Dinah, Lizzie, Titus, Arnold, Ko-Ko, and Pooh-Bah, the cats described in Hartley's text and portrayed in Joan Ramsay's drawings and paintings.
