## Biographical Resume

Sylvia Meagher (pronounced "Marr") is the author of <u>Accessories</u> <u>After the Fact: The Warren Commission, the Authorities, and the Report</u> (Bobbs-Merrill, New York, 1967) and the <u>Subject Index to the Warren</u> <u>Report and the Hearings and Exhibits</u> (Scarecrow Press, New York, 1966), both of which are new out of print. She has written numerous articles on the assassination of President Kennedy, for such magazines as Esquire, The Minority of One, <u>Commonweal</u>, and the <u>Texas Observer</u>.

Mrs. Meagher began to research the assassination virtually on the day of the tragedy. In her long study of the Warren Report and the 26 volumes of testimony and documents, she became convinced that Lee Harvey Oswald had no motive, no means, and no opportunity to commit the assassination. She concluded that Oswald was entirely innocent and the victim of a calculated frame-up.

Mrs. Meagher was born in New York City in 1921 and resides in Greenwich Village. She attended Brooklyn College but interrupted her studies to begin a 25-year career in an international health organization lined to the United Nations, where she serves as a senier official.
