ADDRESS BOOK OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On November 27, 1963, Captain WILL FRITZ, Dallas, Texas Police Department, made available to SA JAMES P. MOSEY, JR., an address book found at the residence of LEE HARVEY OSWALD 1026 North Beckley, Dallas, Texas, on November 22, 1963. This address book contains names, addresses, phone numbers and other writings in the English and Russian languages. The following are names, addresses, notations and data that have not been previously reported. The pages of the address book are not numbered but for clarity and reference purposes, the pages are referred to by page number, some referring to their numerical sequence as they are contained in the book, being numbered from front to back:

Mr. ALEXANDER KREHMERER, 3542 Kent Street, telephone WA 3-2525, who is employed at Lomo Industries, Inc., Highway 81 South, advised that approximately three years ago he was stationed in Europe as the foreign representative for Lomo Industries, Inc., commonly referred to as Lomo Plastics.

For the purpose of obtaining catalogs from competitors in Europe, he was authorized by his company to use Post Office Box 11333, registered in the name of Texas Import-Export Company, Fort Worth, Texas. This was necessary to conceal his connection with Lomo Industries, Inc., from competitors.

After KREHMERER returned to the United States, he did not use Post Office Box 11333 to receive any mail, or use it as a return address in any correspondence, personal or for Lomo Industries, Inc. He stated that as far as he knows, this post office box is still maintained by Lomo Industries, Inc., in the name Texas Import-Export Company. He stated Lomo Industries also presently has Post Office Box No. 11277 at Fort Worth, Texas.

KREHMERER advised that sometime in about the fall of 1962 he was dating HELENA HALL, who was then divorced from her husband, and that he had a lot of his personal belongings at her residence in Fort Worth, Texas. When HELENA HALL was in New York after her automobile accident in the fall of 1962, MARINA OSWALD occupied HELENA HALL's home for a short period. He stated LEE HARVEY OSWALD visited MARINA on occasions at the HALL residence.

When HELENA HALL remarried her former husband, KREHMERER left a lot of his personal belongings at the HALL residence, among which was stationery bearing address of Texas Import-Export Company, Post Office Box 11333, Fort Worth, Texas.

KREHMERER stated that neither LEE HARVEY OSWALD nor MARINA OSWALD had any connection whatsoever with the Texas Import-Export Company and could not have received any mail at Post Office Boxes 11333 or 11277 in Fort Worth, Texas.
