Assassination of President Kennedy - Testimony of Lt. Jack Revill, Dallas Police Department, before the Commission

Lt. Jack Revill of the Dallas Police Department contacted me relative to a discrepancy as to the address of Lee Harvey Oswald as shown on a Dallas Public Library card found in possession of Oswald at the time of his arrest on the afternoon of November 22, 1963.

Lt. Revill stated that he had the eddress as 605 Elsbeth, Dallas, Texas, which had been given to him orally by Detective B. K. Carroll of the Dallas Police Department. Lt. Revill stated that he had talked to Detective Carroll who had informed him that he was driving the car that brought Oswald from the theater in Oak Cliff where he was arrested, and that one of the officers sitting on the back seat with Oswald was checking through Oswald's billfold and called his attention to the library card and that he, Carroll, looked back over his shoulder at the card and thought that it showed the address as 605 Elsbeth, Dallas, Texas. Lt. Revill stated that he had examined a photostatic copy of the Dillas Public Library card and that the address appears to be 602 Elsbeth, the correct address.

It is requested that this information be conveyed to the Commission.
