
Dear Donovan,

In reference to my memo to you of 17 Nov. please find enclosed the work of Mark Allen on The Mexico City Trip. During the year since he compiled this we have had several new releases of C.I.A. and F.B.I. documents relevant to the subject and these have yet to be incorporated. As I suggested before, the questions raised by this latest news report alleging threatening remarks to Oswald bring into play a lengthy and complex set of evidence and undeveloped leads. Perhaps outstanding, and Mark Allen would also point this out, is the exchange (somewhat heated as it is told) between another Cuban Consulate employee, named Ascue and Oswald. We have only C.I.A. speculation that Oswalds possessing information after the fact of Ascues transfer did not imply some sort of inside information.

Certainly all of the foregoing would be accorded a cautious amount of consideration at this stage in light of more central evidence to be tested with regard to the lone assassin theory and the impact those findings would have on peripheral investigations. Needless to say Mark Allen and I are available to you for additional consultation on these matters and any others on which we can be of assistance.

Also for your reference I am enclosing a copy of Mark's resume. His work speaks for itself in it's thoroughness and documentation. In addition if I may offer my observation as someone who has worked with him and knows him personally. He is a hard working gentleman, someone who would be a tremendous asset to your staff.
