Captain WILL FRITZ, Homicide Bureau, Dallas Police Department, related that one live round of 6.5 rifle ammunition was found in the chamber of the rifle at the time he examined the rifle at the crime scene where LEE HARVEY OSWALD allegedly shot President KENNEDY. He stated the rifle was recovered not far from the window in the Texas School Book Depository which spot was believed to have been used by OSWALD at the time he shot President KENNEDY. FRITZ stated there was only one live round of 6.5 ammunition recovered and that no live round of 6.5 ammunition was recovered from the person of OSWALD at the time he was arrested. He stated that the "Dallas Times Herald" had contacted him concerning this and that they had reported the live round of 6.5 ammunition was recovered from OSWALD's person when it should have been reported that this live round of 6.5 ammunition was actually recovered from the gun that OSWALD was believed to have used in the shooting of the President. FRITZ stated the Dallas Police Department had recovered only one live round of 6.5 ammunition and this was turned over to the FBI on the night of November 22, 1963.
