

Notes on phonecall 1/1/65 from Curtis Crawford after his visit to Archives to see Zapruder slides

Mrs. Kennedy's position (hat) same until frames 260-270. She watched crowd to right of JFK.

Hill reaction much later than 204...Mrs. K's recollection seems incorrect

At no time is there any marked change in the position of Mrs. K's head

Governor Connally: no evidence (223) he turned or was doing anything but look toward the crowd at the right. Same is true of Kellerman. Governor's shoulders at 225-227 go left somewhat.

Thinks JFK's reaction to shot starts about 223, and Governor C does seem to react about 230-231

Governor C in 229 - white flare may be beginning of hand motion

Amazing: reaction time between Gov C and JFK only 1/3 second apart

Governor's right shoulder then dips; head in relation to Mrs K's head is significantly lower. Right turn seemed man clutching himself pulling right

Film seems to verify Mrs. Connally's statement that he crumpled up

In 226 JFK mouth opens

No indication words from JFK or Gov C

Crawford felt if Gov C hit in 222-225 had right shoulder slightly to right --so while reaction time supports WC theory, position not proper

Slides 207 and 212 spliced

Head shot, for angles of expl, up -- slightly forward. A spray of matter went almost straight up and then toward road to left

Crawford tried to trace trajectory Gov C wounds using lab. skeleton; "confirmed" his position in 218 would produce the known trajectory

On balance, Crawford feels WC has very strong evidence for its theory of a single bullet

There is one interruption in the slides' sequence and one slide is misnumbered

Mr. Marcy took Crawford down and let him use view finder

Projectionist offered microscope
