Thank you very much for your letter of April 12, 1965 in which you kindly provided information about the records of the Warren Commission. In the light of the fact that much of the material is not yet available for use, I shall reconsider my plan to visit the Archives--assuming that I receive the necessary permission--at this time and arrange the trip somewhat later, perhaps during summer vacation.

I do have the Hearings in my home but have found the Zapruder frames in Volume XVIII of considerable interest. However, I should find it helpful to view the color transparencies, in which details are probably more sharply defined. My interest in the Warren Commission records is related to the preparation of a book on the Oswald case, evaluating the physical and circumstantial evidence within a broader study of the socio-legal-political setting of the assassination.
