Thanks for your letter of the 25th. If you can manage to write an article, it should be 2500-3000 words (longer if you like) and deal with the assassinations of JFK, Martin Luther King, and RFK, or any one of them. There are a great variety of aspects to explore—whether these are random murders or connected, the way the events have been covered by the news media, the public and/or governmental reaction (gun laws agitation, protection of candidates, etc.), the implications for the election of a new president and for future policy, epidemicity of assassinations in other eras and countries (Japan in the late 1920's and early 1930's), role of the FBI as assassination investigation agency, or anything that seems to you needs to be said.
