JIM MAC CAMMON, owner of Jim MacCammon Associates, 3121 Routh Street, telephone No. RI 7-1701, advised he resides at 6924 Walling, Dallas, Texas, telephone No. DI 8-4752.

MAC CAMMON advised that on November 22, 1963, he was outside the Texas School Book Depository Building, 411 Elm Street, when he heard over the Dallas police radio that a Dallas police officer had been shot in the Oak Cliff section of Dallas. MAC CAMMON stated following this police broadcast he accompanied a Dallas police officer to the Oak Cliff section of Dallas and was in the Texas Theatre at the time of OSWALD's capture.

MAC CAMMON stated he had his 35 mm camera equipped with a "Strobe light" with him. He said he took a series of five photographs at the Texas Theatre, three inside the theatre and two outside the theatre. Of the three photographs taken inside the Texas Theatre, MAC CAMMON stated only one came out since a police officer stepped in front of his "Strobe light" just as he snapped two of the pictures.

The three good photographs have been given the following designations:

GERALD L. HILL Exhibit A

Capture of OSWALD inside Texas Theatre.

GERALD L. HILL Exhibit B

OSWALD in custody of police outside the Texas Theatre.

GERALD L. HILL Exhibit C

Crowd scene outside entrance of Texas Theatre following OSWALD's capture.

MAC CAMMON advised that he sold the above photographs to "Life" magazine and that NATALIE KOSEX, position unknown, "Life" magazine, Rockefeller Center, New York City, has the original 35 mm color slide of the above photograph given the designation GERALD L.

HILL Exhibit A. MAC CAMMON stated he believes he has the original 35 mm color slide of the above photograph given the designation GERALD L. HILL Exhibit B. He said he is not sure if he has the original 35 mm color slide from which the GERALD L. HILL Exhibit C was made or if "Life" magazine has it.

MAC CAMMON stated that pressure of business has kept him and his staff from properly indexing and filing his numerous color slides and, consequently, he does not know the exact location of the above-mentioned 35 mm color slides. After searching through numerous loose slides in various boxes, loose slides on desks, tables, and on the floor, MAC CAMMON stated he could not locate the originals of any of the above color slides. He did locate and furnish a duplicate 35 mm color slide from which the photograph designated GERALD L. HILL Exhibit B was made. He stated this color slide is an exact duplicate of the original color slide. MAC CAMMON was requested to, and he advised he would, continue searching for the original of this slide and also for the original 35 mm slide from which the photograph given the designation GERALD L. HILL Exhibit C was made.
