Garrison and investigators, Bradley said, interviewed the four persons in Los Angeles, who said Bradley "did willfully and unlawfully conspire with others to murder John F. Kennedy." Edgar Eugene Bradley, indicted in: New Orleans in 1967 on charges of: criminal conspiracy to murder President John F. Kennedy, Monday won-\$1 for malicious prosecution from two Los Angeles residents who led prosecutors to him.

New Orleans Dist. Atty. James Garrison dropped the criminal charges against Bradley, now 57, of North Hollywood on June 26, 1970, but the accusation still haunts him.

"I am very disappointed, naturally," Bradley said outside the courtroom of Superior Judge Edward J. O'Connor after the five-man, sevenwoman jury handed down its \$1 verdict.
