FRANK PIZZO, Assistant Manager, Downtown Lincoln-Mercury, 118 East Commerce, residence 800 Burns, telephone FE 1-1831, stated during the afternoon of November 22, 1963, he heard the name of LEE OSWALD on a radio newscast in connection with the latter's arrest as a suspect in the assassination of President KENNEDY. He said he recognized the name and asked ALBERT G. BOGARD, salesman, if he did not have a prospect of the same name. BOGARD stated that he had, in fact, and after discussion and on viewing newspaper photographs of OSWALD on November 23, 1963, he recognized him as an individual who had been in the showroom some several days proviously and who had talked to Mr. BOGARD. He recalled BCGARD had remarked on the extended demonstration ride OSWALD had taken. He said he had not seen this itdividual again to the best of his knowledge.
