After they returned home, she prepared lunch and she is of the opinion that LEE OSWALD spent the afternoon watching a football game on television.

Mrs. PAINE recalls she was away from her home some time between 4:00 and 5:00 P.M. when she went to a nearby school to cast her ballot. Mrs. PAINE stated she was away from her home at this time probably 45 minutes and that this was the longest period she was away from home on this date, other than the trip to the drivers license station.

She stated that she did not stop at any car dealers while en route from Irving to the drivers license station, and back, and specifically stated she did not stop at Downtown Lincoln-Mercury, 118 East Commerce Street, Dallas, Texas. She stated that in her opinion, it would have been impossible for LEE HARVEY OSWALD to be at the Downtown Lincoln-Mercury, in Dallas, Texas, on November 9, 1963, since he was not out of her sight for a sufficient portion of the day to make such a trip.
