Luncheon - Dec. 2, 1977

Event sponsored by J & J in Princeton

Chas. Baxter, M.D.

Lenny initiated discussion by asking Dr. Baxter
if he had been at Parkland Hospital at
the time of the Kennedy assassination.

Yes, he had been on the team.

C & B burst through doors with guns telling
everyone not to move.

2 bullet wounds in Kennedy:

- the one in neck, clean as a whistle - hit
virtually nothing and exited.

- the other bullet blew the back of Kennedy's
head off and although he was alive for
about 10 minutes after arrival, the doctors decided
not to open chest for heart massage because
he was a vegetable.

1 bullet hit Connally

- he was raising his arm to turning around
after hearing the first shot and was shot
himself through shoulder, wrist, lung & thigh -
all with one bullet. He was very badly

injured and is left without a major
portion of one lung.

One bullet was found on a stretcher.

Dr. Baxter feels that bullets could be fired
as quickly as the Farwood Report claims.
He himself belongs to a gun club.
