Dear Mrs. Meagher:

Enclosed is a copy of the article that Shelley Braverman published in Guns magazine (May, 1967). I thought that you might like to have it for your files.

As far as I know, Braverman's article is the only work concerning the Warren Report that has appeared in any of the gun magazines. I read almost all of them, and I do not think that I would have missed an article on the assassination.

It appears from the article that Braverman is familiar only with the Report and has not consulted the evidence in the other volumes; nor does he seem to know the writings of any of the critics. Even so, he seems convinced that the Commission's case is fraudulent, at least in those matters which concern firearms.

Braverman's notion that a Mitrgliada bullet was used is wrong, as you will easily conclude. Even if the idea were plausible, Braverman does not address the question ~~where~~ how "Oswald" came into possession of a bullet that is of more interest to collectors than to assassins. Mitrgliada bullets are quite rare.
