Dear Sylvia:

Thanks for the copious information on bullet fragments CEs 567 and 569. I had hoped at most to be able to tap your memory merely for the information whether there was a record of who found the fragments, for I wanted to avoid searching for something that wasn't there. The information in the letter will be most helpful.

I have no trouble believing that CE 399 never hurt anybody, so it is only those two fragments that keep me from asserting definitely that "Oswald's" rifle was not used for the assassination. That assertion requires the charge that the SS planted the fragments in the car. I don't reject that notion, but I can't adequately defend it, either. If anything turns up from what I do regarding the fragments, I'll let you know.

I have Accessories and the Subject Index (I made a Xerox copy of it for myself from a copy I got through interlibrary loan).

If I make requests in the future, I'll try to be more specific regarding the degree of probing that I would like, for I don't want you to go to the trouble of doing things that I could do for myself.

Thanks again for the information on the fragments. It is everything that I need.
