☐ Rededication Day. President Johnson proclaimed Sunday (Nov. 22) a day of national rededication in memory of President John F. Kennedy (assassinated in Dallas, Tex., Nov. 22, 1963). Johnson called for rededication "to the pursuit of those ideals of dignity in which he believed." *Because the first anniversary of the assassination falls on Sunday the religious note was expected to prevail.* [Details on Page 5]

☐ Assassination probe. Warren Commission testimony from 552 witnesses, plus exhibits in the investigation of President Kennedy's assassination (26 volumes weighing 54 pounds, \$76-per-set) will be released to the public Nov. 30—but even that won't be the complete story. Commission counsel J. Lee Rankin told the Herald Tribune classified material involving national security is being withheld. *Upshot: Mystery remains.* [Page 5]

☐ Hoover flap. FBI director Hoover's blasts at Dr. Martin Luther King and the Warren Commission kicked up a storm. King accused Hoover of irresponsible action. Negro spokesmen met with President Johnson, sided with King's view that the FBI had not protected Negroes in the South. Warren Commission member Allen Dulles said he regrets Hoover's caustic criticism. *Question raised: Would Hoover (who reaches retirement age of 70 on Jan. 1) be asked to step out by Johnson?* [Page 1]
