Dear Mr. Gertler,

I am writing to you at the suggestion of Mrs. Dorothy Henderson, whom I met yesterday in the course of her interviews with former associates of Brock Chisholm. She thought that I should send you the enclosed article on the report of the Warren Commission on the assassination of President Kennedy. I wrote this article after careful study of the report but before the release of the twenty-six volumes of hearings and exhibits. After some days of concentrated reading in those volumes, I believe that the article should be expanded to book length. The defects which are described in the enclosed article are not removed by the hearings and exhibits--on the contrary, my reading thus far has really shocked me. I have found that the Warren Commission was guilty not only of carelessness, contradictions, and omissions but of falsification. Consequently, it seems to me impossible to accept the Commission's conclusions concerning the sole guilt of Lee Harvey Oswald.

It is a matter of conscience to me to seek to inform the public of the terrible injustice done to Oswald and the urgent need to establish the truth about what really happened in Dallas in November 1963. I have not carried out any personal investigation on the scene but I do have access to the findings of others who have done so. However, my basic approach is to expose the fraudulence of the Warren Report in terms of its internal evidence, and to avoid wild speculations and reliance on rumor.

I should mention that I am an official of an international organization and could not publish a book of this nature under my own name. If you have any interest in seeing the manuscript when it is completed, as Mrs. Henderson

thought probable, I should be glad to hear that and to discuss arrangements. I believe it will take a minimum of six months to complete a first draft, since I must first read painstakingly the fifty-two pounds of fine print which the Warren Commission has finally released.

I look forward to hearing from you.
