Dear Mr. Thompson,

Thanks for your letter of 8 January 1965 and your helpful comments. I am still weighing alternatives and will not make any decision about writing or publishing until I have actually completed study of the hearings and exhibits published by the Warren Commission. This in itself will require another few months of concentrated reading and analysis. For that reason, I feel that the books soon to be published (I believe that Mark Lane, Leo Sauvage, and Joachim Joesten are scheduled for early publication) will be quite different, of necessity, from the book I envisage. One publisher (Canadian) has indicated interest but has attached a condition which causes me serious difficulties. A fellow-researcher has suggested that I co-author a book with him, and this is a possibility since his approach is extremely painstaking and factual. Consequently, I shall leave matters in abeyance for the present and perhaps at a later time will take advantage of your invitation to write again.
