You made out a most impressive case against the official thesis that Oswald, acting alone, was the assassin—although I must confess that I was already certain that the case against him was untenable. Now, having read that marvel of obfuscation and misrepresentation, the report of the Warren Commission, I have returned to your book with renewed appreciation.
