Dear Miss Meagher:


Thank you for your letter of November 29.

I agree with you that it is absolutely essential for the health of the country that the Federal government and its instruments explore the events in Dallas down to the very last period. Otherwise there will be strife, division, and suspicion and rumor--both founded and unfounded--for decades to come. All the results of the investigation, as well as the extent of it have to be made completely public. I am confident that the special Presidential Commission will make a thorough and impartial investigation, and that all of the phases you mention will be carefully explored.

You may be interested in having a copy of the bill I introduced with regard to U.S. citizens employed at the United Nations.
