Dear Mr. Lane,

Last night I attended your final lecture at the Jan Hus theater and, in fact, as you arrived I handed you a typewritten list of questions. Except for the first question, the list dealt mainly with defects or ambiguities in the Warren Commission report. Unfortunately, I did not have the opportunity to ask more than one of the questions after the lecture. Perhaps you or some other member of the Committee might wish to provide some of the information?

I would greatly appreciate replies to those questions and, in addition, I would be grateful to receive, if possible, (1) a typed copy of the Seymour Weitzman affidavit, which you projected on the screen during the lecture; and (2) further information on the circumstances surrounding the suicide of the stripteaser named Norton, about ten days ago, which you referred to during the evening.

My reasons for requesting this material will be clear from the enclosed copy of a letter I am sending today to Mr. I. F. Stone, after reading his outrageous and shocking newsletter of October 5th. I have taken every possible opportunity since the black day of the assassination to call attention to the intolerable violations of truth and individual rights which characterize the official case. In doing so, I have relied heavily on your "brief" and lectures and on the books by Buchanan and Loesten as well as other critics. It is very important, in discussing the Warren report, to have specific detailed information and sources---it is hard enough to make an impression on those who accept the Warren report on trust, even with such data.

One can only have the greatest admiration for your perseverance in challenging officialdom, in the face of enormous odds and attempts at intimidation. I have already sent a small contribution to the work of the Committee and intend to continue supporting these efforts so far as my finances permit. Enclosed herewith is a small check. I should like to be considered a member of the Committee and in the event of any financial emergency, please call upon me and I will do my utmost. I can also volunteer assistance with any typing chores which I might be able to undertake at home.
