Subject: Assassination of President Kennedy

Dear Justice Warren,

A letter to the editor, published in the current issue of Workers' World, claims that the proof of Oswald's innocence is contained in a photograph taken just as the President was shot which shows Oswald standing in the doorway of the Texas Book Depository building. This photograph was widely reprinted in national magazines such as Life and the Saturday Evening Post. I am enclosing a copy taken from the New York Post in which I have circled in red the figure identified as Oswald in the letter to the editor. I have examined with a magnifying glass a better print of the same photograph in the Saturday Evening Post and was struck by the strong resemblance to Oswald of the man in the doorway.

Perhaps this has already come to your attention but I am taking the liberty of writing in case it has not. I have been very impressed by the brief prepared by Mark Lane analyzing the gaps, contradictions, and inconsistency of much of the evidence. I am convinced that there is a strong possibility that Oswald did not commit this frightful crime and that he may have been the victim of gross carelessness or worse on the part of the investigating agencies which have blandly heralded his guilt. The fact that the FBI report has not been made public can only strengthen the suspicion that it does not stand up to objective scrutiny.

I have no doubt whatever that you personally will do everything humanly possible to determine the truth. With great respect,
