- (1) The presence of imposter "Secret Service agents" behind the Book Depository and on the grassy knoll immediately after the shooting
- (2) The use by the Dallas Police of one of Oswald's former home addresses before they had known access to the information, if as they claimed they had no knowledge of Oswald before the assassination
- (3) Evidence that Oswald was not on the sixth floor at the time of the shooting and that he had an alibi
- (b) The arbitrary change and falsification of dates by the Warren Commission
- (5) Evidence that the "homemade paper bag" in which the rifle supposedly was carried may be planted evidence to incriminate Oswald
- (6) Evidence casting doubt on the authenticity of Oswald's palmprint on the rifle
- (7) Perjured testimony by police witnesses
- (8) Evidence that the police were pursuing Oswald before his absence from the Depository was reported
- (9) Evidence casting doubt on the authenticity of the ammunition clip and on Oswald's purchase or possession of rifle ammunition at any time
- (10) Proof that the Warren Report gives false information on the source of the broadcast description of the Tippit killer and evidence casting grave doubt on the official explanation of Tippit's presence on the street where he was shot to death
- (11) Evidence reopening the question of "A. Hidell," and the Commission's allegation that it was an alias invented by Oswald
- (12) Evidence challenging the explanation in the Warren Report for the presence in Oswald's notebook of FBI Agent Hosty's auto license number
- (13) Oswald's "deathbed" denial of guilt
- (14) FEI intimidation of witnesses alleged to but not investigated by the Warren Commission
- (15) Oswald's strange relationship with the State Department
- (16) Evidence that assertions in the Warren Report about Ruby's activities after the assassination and about his means of entry into the police basement are inaccurage or false.
- (17) A new look at the "two-Oswald" evidence
