In addition to the Report and the Hearings, I'd read the "popular" magazine articles, Inquest, Whitewash, Rush To Judgement and Unanswered Questions About President Kennedy's Assassination...I tried, however, to consider only the <u>firearms</u> matters for comment.

It seems that if the Parkland bullet was first seen on a stretcher the testimony would reflect doubt as to which of the two stretchers the bullet was on when Wright arrived; actually the testimony indicates doubt as to which of the stretchers the bullet came from prior to observation by Tomlinson or Wright. Incidentally, I couldn't find any transcript of any testimony by Wright; without such (to complete the chain) I know of no court that would allow the Parkland bullet into evidence.
