Dear Mrs. Meagher:

The tone of my letter was unfortunate. Maybe if you would reread it you would see that when I said "put you on the right path", I was mocking myself; also I said "brilliant" theory, as part of the same self-mockery. Nor did I mean to demand anything. I hope you will forgive me. I merit your rebuke, for my clumsiness, but not, I think, for my intent.

I know you do not have time. I will therefore curtail this, except to say that I have studied the Z frames as best I can. This is, of course, the first thing I did. It is not quite accurate to say that all appear and that all hands are visible. On the left hand side, the men appear but the right hand of the inside one is not visible though the handlegrip sometimes appears to be. I seem to detect movements.

On the hand side, the inside man vanishes just at 207, would appear in closeup in 207-212, were they were not missing, and does not appear in 210, printed elsewhere, since the left hand side is missing. Never again appears, even in Z255.

Thus, I think I am not so remiss as you suggest. I have, in fact, done my simple duty: I continue to do it: that is, I try constantly to prove myself wrong because the whole thing is as uncelievable to me as it seems to you. On the other hand I cannot honorably dismiss what my reason forces me to consider seriously.
