Dear Sylvia:

Enclosed is a memo on some recent research, partly stimulated by ^{some of} your own observations, which may be of interest. There is certainly something fishy about the Oswald mail-order gun purchases and the Dallas Police's convenient "finding" of the Klein's ads among his possessions (CE 2003, pp. 177 & 290; Stevall testimony & exhibits, especially 7H194-195), and I thought it might be of interest to you to see some of the other stuff that appeared in American Rifleman along about the time of his supposed ordering.

I have not tried to draw any conclusions in re the explosive ammunition, but it should be fairly obvious that I'm thinking about the JFK head shot, the grassy knoll hypothesis, and similar matters. There needs to be a lot more thinking about these matters, I feel.
