Dear Sylvia:

I enclose a copy of a memo which I think you will find of interest in regard to the Walker matter. This was prepared as a Groult of personal examination of some of the Archives' exhibits by Mike Clark, a GWU law student, and myself. Mike has been working with me on this and is well informed about the JFK assassination generally, having read your book (and re-discovering things in it!) just as I. He will be writing you in the near future.

I blush at my oversight of the item on op. 220-221 of your book, and note that the CE you cite is a duplication (but much more readable) of the one I was so proud of.

Evidently the writers of the Warren Report also kept re-discovering things.

There are several things in your letter of 3/26 as well as the one of 3/21 which I want to comment upon, but I'll hold off for a few days because of the press of other business and the need to organize my thoughts. Also, I have someone working on the grammar and spelling in CE 1 as a check on Cadigan's identification of Oswald as the writer, and I'd like to be able to report on that.

Loose thought: Could the incident referred to on p. 93 of your book (CE 1409) have been the true stimulus for the Oswald note (CE 1) and Marina's subsequent recollections

of the "Walker" incident?
