Thank you for sending me your progress report, the copy of your September 1969 letter to Earl Warren, and the other interesting enclosures. Naturally I am gratified that you selected "Accessories" to send to Warren and I appreciate your generous characterization of the book. It speaks volumes that Warren refuses to "receive mail on <u>that</u> subject" and it seems to me that that very refusal vindicates the thesis that the Warren Report was not the product of mere ineptitude or superficiality but of a purposeful miscarriage of justice, and that it stands as an act of deliberate fraud.

Regarding your useful bibliography ("II. John F. Kennedy"), there is no book "Honest Verdict" by Jacob Cohen. It is true that Cohen announced his intention of writing a book which would vindicate the Warren Report, which supposed book was prematurely mentioned in a recent biography of Warren. But the book was never written, no doubt because it proved impossible to justify the official findings. Wesley Liebeler had announced his intention to write the same kind of book, back in 1966, but his project like Cohen's came to nothing.

The two abortive books, plus Warren's refusal to even receive communications on the subject, self-evidently constitute a default and an implicit admission of the impossibility of defending the Warren Report.
