Should you find it necessary to call me on the phone, the best time to get me at home is about 10 AM. Since the death of my wife, I have been living with my mother, and she is at present in a wheel chair as a result of a hip operation. My mother had a fall when running to answer the phone, so it is better that she ignore the telephone bell when alone.

You may wonder how I can go on a vacation, so the answer is that my sister will have my mother at her home for the two and a half weeks, as she figures I need a vacation.

When in Fort Lauderdale, I will meet some people who doubt that Oswald was the assassin, and reason that it was quite easy to pin it on a man who had a bad record.
