Lieutenant J. C. DAY, Crime Scene Search Section, Dallas Police Department, advised that he recalled that a lunch sack and soft drink bottle had been found on the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository Building at 411 Elm Street, Dallas, on November 22, 1963, during the rearch of the floor area. He advised that to the best of his memory, the chicken bones, lunch sack and soft drink bottle were found in the same general area on the sixth floor. After reviewing a photograph taken of the lunch sack and bottle, he stated that they were found in the third aisle from the Houston Strest side of the building and that the bottle was sitting approximately three feet from the lunch sack.

DAY related that they later ascertained that the lunch sack and soft drink bottle were placed there by another employee other than OSWALD and that no further effort was made to identify the person responsible. He stated that he later had dusted the soft drink bottle to ascertain if it contained the prints of LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated that this check met with negative results. DAY stated that he maintained the lunch sack and soft drink bottle in his office for several weeks and, after deciding it had no value to the case, he had thrown the sack and bottle away.
