Cohen wrote that 25 to 32 Xrays and at least 15 to 20 photographs had been taken of Kenhedy's body after the assassination. He argued these could show whether a wound in the president's back had been high enough to sustain the theory of a single bullet wounding both the president and Gov. John B. Connally Jr. of Texas. They could also, he contended, re-fute suggestions that the president might have been shot from the front or side-a theory requiring a second assassin.

It was unclear, he wrote, whether the Warren Commission "ever requested and received the X-rays." He reported that several commission lawyers had told him the photographs and possibly the X-rays had been withheld from publication at the request of Sen. Robert F. Kennedy, the late president's brother.
