Stocks Get Another Setback

NEW YORK (UPI) — Stocks took another turn for the worse at noon today, just when they looked like they might be pulling out from under Thursday's crushing defeat.

Dow-Jones' industrial average, which took its sharpest setback in over a year Thursday, bounced up 1.33 early today but was back down 1.84 by 11:30 a. m. Although some prices showed signs of moving slightly above their lows just before the lunch hour, the general tone still was castier.

Losses of large fractions to more than a point in Sears Roebuck, Texaco, and General Foods contributed to the weakness in the senior Dow-Jones indicator. Xerox, which tumbled 2 1/2 Thursday, was back up around 7.

Polaroid and IBM also down heavily in Thursday's book, lost another 2 each. Control Data, improved slightly. Motors appeared undecided which way to turn. News of record mid-November sales for Ford tended to help the auto group somewhat.

Jones & Laughlin shed more than a point in a mixed steel section. Chemicals were mostly lower with the exception of DuPont which advanced nearly 2. Allied, Olin Matheson, Commercial Solvents and Rohm & Haas tumbled.

Boston Bank Low On City Bond Issue

Shawmut National Bank, Boston, was low bidder Thursday on a combined Gas & Electric Dept. and Board of Public Works bond issue totaling \$1,578,000.

Shawmut bid a premium of \$881.55 with an interest rate of 3 per cent. This gave a net interest rate of 2.994312. The net cost on the combined bond issue will be \$493,928.54 over the life of the issues.

The G&E Bond is for \$400,000 for construction of a second point of entry for natural gas lines and a gas line under the accelerated public works program of the federal government.

The BPW bond amounts to \$1,178,000.

Sniper Also Wounds Texas Gov. Connally

DALLAS — Two priests who were with Kennedy say he is dead of bullet wounds.

DALLAS (UPI)—President Kennedy and Gov. John B. Connally of Texas were cut down by an assassin's bullets as they toured downtown Dallas in an open automobile today.

The President, his limp body cradled in the arms of his wife, was rushed to Parkland Hospital.

The Governor also was taken to Parkland.

Clint Hill, a Secret Service agent assigned to Mrs. Kennedy, said "he's dead," as the President was lifted from the rear of a White House touring car, the famous "bubbletop" from Washington. He was rushed to an emergency room in the hospital.

The incident occurred just east of the triple underpass facing a park in downtown Dallas.

Reporters about five car lengths behind the Chief Executive heard what sounded like three bursts of gunfire.

Secret Service agents in a follow-up car quickly unlimbered their automatic rifles.

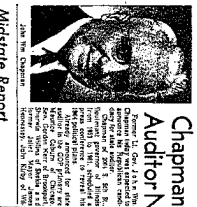

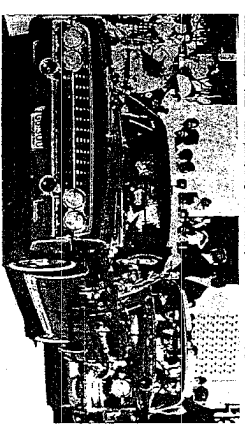

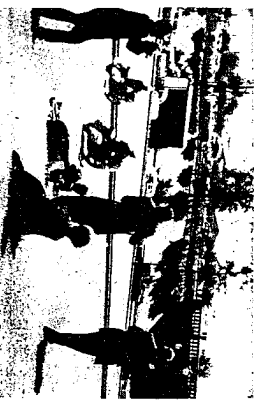

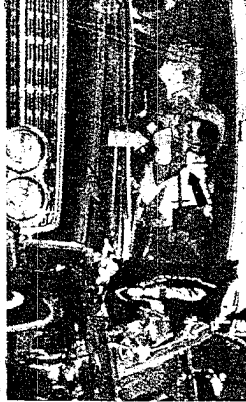

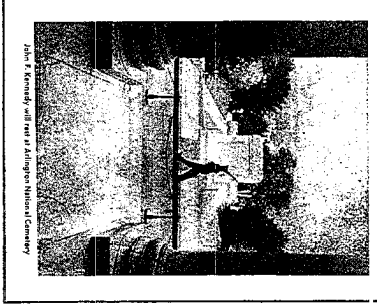

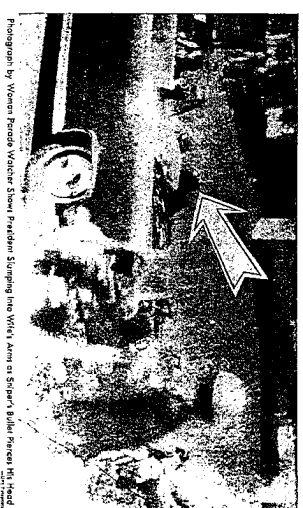

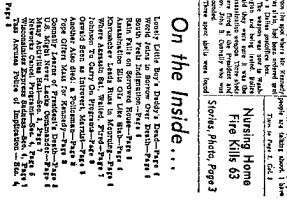

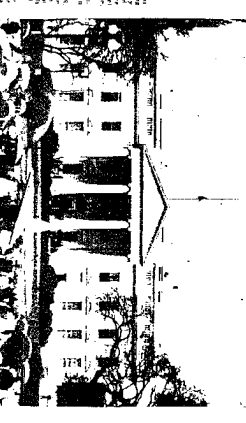

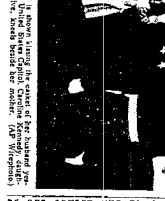

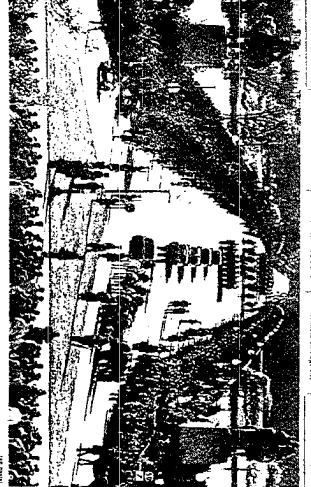

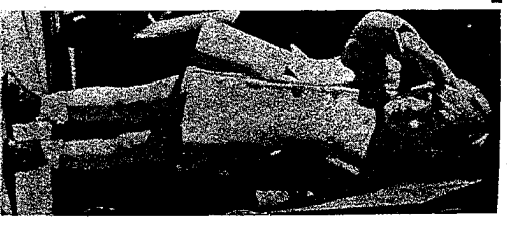

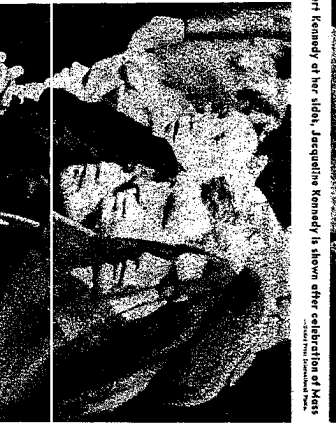

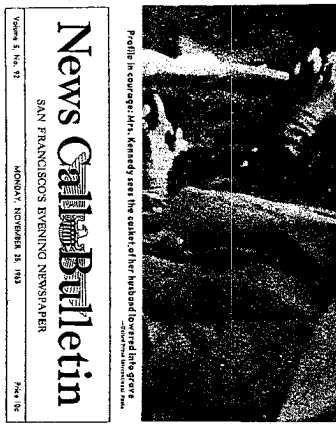
